



The approval for courses is on the specific condition that faculty and physical academic infrastructure must be in place by April 20, 2018 to be confirmed by the University to the Commission followed by verification by the Inspection Committee failing which the approval of courses where faculty and infrastructure will be found deficient shall be deemed as withdrawn and no future correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
- 2. The University shall indicate the following in its prospectus for the information of the students, general public and State Govt.:
 - a. Names and academic bio-data of faculty available for each course.
 - b. Physical academic infrastructure must find mention in the prospectus.
 - c. Course wise seats approved indicating the seats reserved for the scheduled caste/scheduled tribe/ physically handicapped and Himachali candidates.
 - d. Seats wherein available under lateral entry be mentioned specifically.
 - e. Approved fee structure for each course.
 - f. Scholarship scheme(s), if any.





Kindly refer to your letter No. EU/RO/RC/25 dated 23/02/2018 and letter No. EU/RO/RC/25 dated 13/03/2018 on the subject cited above. In this context, I am directed to to convey the decision of this Commission as under:-

- 1. As per detail submitted by you, there are only two functional qualified teachers in Agronomy and during the 2017-18, two students have already been allowed whereas in 2018-19, also two students in M.Sc. have been allowed, but keeping in view your request 2 more students are allowed to be admitted making total number of students to be admitted in the Academic Session 2018-19 to 4. Moreover these degree programmes are research and thesis based so it cannot be equated to general master programmes. Since M.Sc. Agriculture involves lot of theoretical and field oriented experimentation, the work load w.r.t. guiding a student is heavy. Hence to guide two students at a time is an arduous job for a teacher when the course is being started for the first time.
- 2. There are only two teachers in Plant Pathology and in M.Sc. Plant Pathology 4 seats have been allowed which are sufficient initially.
- 3. In entomology, there are two teachers and 4 students in Masters programme have been allotted. Being Research and Thesis basis based degree programme two students per teacher are more than sufficient in a year to be guided. At present out of these two teachers Ms. Priyanka Thakur is pursuing her Ph.D. Allotment of seats is justified.
- 4. In M.Sc. Horticulture., the said course is research-cum-Thesis based along with coursework and there are only two teachers in Horticulture and there was no admission during last Academic Session 2017-18. Therefore considering all these facts, the Regulatory Commission decided to grant 4 seats in M.Sc. (Horticulture).

5. DOCTORAL/ RESEARCH PROGRAMMES:

Request for Doctoral Programme was considered and decided as under:

(a) Ph.D. (Computer Science Engineering):

There is only one teacher and students already enrolled are still continuing, so no more students are allowed to be enrolled during the Academic Session 2018-19





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

Apart from the above, it may also please be noted that the University has to take immediate action on the following:

- No off campus centre(s) is opened by the University outside the territorial jurisdiction of the State in view of the judgement of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in case of Prof. Yash Pal Vs State of Chhattisgarh.
- 2. In case the University has already started any off campus centre outside the State, it must be closed immediately. It may also be ensured that any off campus centre within the State shall be opened only as per the provision laid down in the UGC (Establishment of and maintenance at standards in Private University) Regulation 2003 and with the prior approval of UGC.
- 3. The University shall not have any affiliated Colleges ...

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4. The University has to follow UGC (Minimum standards and procedure for award of M.Phil / Ph.D degree) Regulations, 2009.
